Oral Requests:

Recreation Supervisor Aaron Bueno shared details on the Valentine Fun Run that is coming up on Feb. 10 including the packet pick up at Sports Basement, medals, and kids dash.

Announcements:

Chair Doherty thanked Commissioner Davidson not only for her time on the Parks and Recreation Commission but also on the Civic Improvement Commission and said she has been a great asset to the community. She will be missed.

Director Maurantonio said that at the Council meeting last night both Charlie and Jacquie were recognized for their service and she shared that next month Charlie will be back on the Commission to finish Jacquie's term. They were recognized for their work on many important policies including updates to the Parks, Field and Athletic Use policy, development of the Park Asset Inventory Management Plan, the establishment of the Parkland Dedication Policy, and consideration of tree appeals and recommending facility improvements at the Community Center and throughout the City.

The Mayor recognized Jacquie's professional expertise in the fields of technology and education, combined with her effective leadership style, excellent communication skills and fun sense of humor made her an outstanding Parks and Recreation Commissioner. Jacquie asked key questions during

deliberations and voiced appreciation to community members who attended Parks and Recreation Commission meetings to share their views. Jacquie was part of the first Leadership Campbell class and in 2013 she was acknowledged as a Woman of Distinction for the City of Campbell. It was also noted that Jacquie had a very long tenure on the Civic Improvement Commission as well. Congratulations Jacquie.

The Mayor said that Charlie Gibson's professional expertise and municipal management related to park, open space and recreation was particularly helpful to all the Commissioners and staff. He often clarified discussions and helped focus the group on pivotal issues. He is a strong proponent of preserving and increasing open space in Campbell. His experience in park planning, playground renovations and recreation programming combined with his vision, sense of humor and willingness to look at issues with a big picture lens made him a very effective Commissioner. Charlie took pride in visiting parks regularly as the chair of the Parks and Creek Trail subcommittee. Charlie's beautiful photography of sites around the city including Edith Morley Park and the Ainsley House have been enjoyed by many through the museum photo contest and as part of the City's website and Activity Guide. The City of Campbell is truly grateful to Charlie Gibson for his 8 years and 10 months of service.

Commissioner Davidson said thank you to the City of Campbell for allowing her to participate for so long and letting her be on the Commissions for as long as she has. She's made a lot of friends, met some great people. She loves Campbell and being a part of Campbell. It's been a great joy serving the City. Charlie has been so great on the PRC as well. She is excited that he is coming back. If anybody can take her place it would be Charlie.

New Business:

A. Review and Approve Historical Plaque at John D. Morgan Park

Assistant City Manager Al Bito gave a presentation on the request to place an interpretive plaque at John D. Morgan Park to recognize the significance of the Sebastian Peralta ranch and adobe that were once in that location.

Joanna Herz, former member of the City's Historic Preservation Board and member of the California Pioneers of Santa Clara County spoke and said she believes that it is important for the community to know and understand the heritage of the land of which John D. Morgan Park is part. She took the Commission through a timeline of events leading up to this request for an interpretive plaque.

MSC: Davidson/Fidrych recommending approval and installation of the plaque at John D. Morgan Park.

B. Parkland Dedication Fund Annual Review

Recreation Services Manager Bissell presented background information on the Parkland Dedication Fund.

Director Capurso said acquisition/providing open space is really why these funds were created. The Parkland fee is to offset the impact of new residents. We are continuing to go through this exercise. We will very likely do a proposal this year to reset our fee based on the actual value of real estate.

There was discussion about the City actually being able to purchase land for a new park and are we doing enough to keep up our current parks. Director Capurso said we could have developers dedicate park land when they come in with their plans. The likelihood of this happening is decreasing, especially with the smaller developments.

Superintendent Mordwinow stated that the number of users per park and the wear and tear on the parks goes up. With this in mind, more funds will be necessary for maintenance.

Commissioner Fidrych said we should be using some of this money for maintenance. Ms. Bissell responded that the Parkland Dedication funds cannot be used for maintenance.

Director Capurso said we could also have shared facilities, such as John D. Morgan Park a portion is owned by the school district. A portion of Campbell Park is owned by the County. Other potential sites would be school sites, or sites owned by private utilities.

Commissioner Santor asked if the money has to be spent in five years. Director Capurso responded that it has to be allocated in five years.

Ms. Bissell clarified that they went through this process of trying to understand what the balance of the fund actually was, going back to 1989, and it was very stressful. The one good thing that came out of this process is that going forward they can clearly identify where the funds came from and where they should be allocated. This is now a great tracking document.

Open for Public comment: No Comments.

MSC: Ishibashi/Mitchell to approve the recommendation of the allocations presented tonight and forward the recommendation to the City Council.

C. Dogs on leash in Campbell parks

Director Capurso presented his report regarding dogs in Campbell parks. At the November 7, 2017 Council meeting the Council voted to place an item on an upcoming Council agenda to review the option of allowing dogs on leash in City of Campbell parks. The Council also voted to refer the vetting of possible locations for an off-leash dog park to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

There's an expectation that staff will go out and do some research and come back to Council. Staff is taking this opportunity to have a touch point with the Commission. In general, most of our neighboring cities allow dogs on leash in most of their parks.

Commissioner Doherty asked if there could be a requirement that the leash must be a certain length. Director Capurso, said yes, on leash, and under control.

Commissioner Ishibashi is strongly in favor.

Commissioner Santor asked what the impact on parks in general would be. Director Capurso responded it will increase maintenance resources.

Commissioner Fidrych asked who would enforce the rules. Director Capurso said chances are the police would not be out looking for things, unless someone reported something. They typically respond to complaints or people calling in. A change in an ordinance would give them something to cite.

Director Capurso said he was remiss in that after their in-house discussions, even if this is a good idea, it shouldn't be carte blanche. We have thought about some reasonable exceptions to dogs in parks. They would not be allowed on athletic fields when in use, children's playgrounds, water features, and the track.

Public Comment:

Charlie Gibson stated this is going in the right direction. Enforcement would really thank you for this because it's clear and obvious that dogs must be on leash.

Straw Poll: Mitchell, Davidson, Doherty, Ishibashi and Santor are for it.

Commissioner Fidrych is not against it but is concerned about kids (dogs in play areas).

Director Capurso said he's hearing that most people are comfortable with this. He is not going to Council yet so will touch on this subject again at the next Parks and Recreation Commission meeting.

Committee Reports:

Parks and Creek Trail: Commissioner Santor said this was his first time at the parks with a different eye. He visited each park and they were amazing, clean, great maintenance. He's looking forward to a new restroom at Campbell Park.

Trees: Commissioner Fidrych had no report but said we need more rain.

Special Events: Commissioner Ishibashi said Aaron Bueno did a good job letting everyone know about the upcoming Fun Run tonight.

Staff Reports:

A. General Plan Monthly Update

Director Capurso said he's hoping that everyone is familiar with the open meetings going on around the community. It's a nice opportunity to get people to some of these meetings that we don't really recognize. We do see a lot of the same faces over and over. At the end of the sessions you're given a

map of the city and colored markers and you mark up the map with what you would like to see. There are two more meetings left, February 12 and March 5.

Parks: Public Works Maintenance Superintendent Mordwinow

- Staff is busy with early spring projects. Lots of people at the parks; we are having to spend more time on litter pickup. He gave a shout out to Vince and his staff; they are doing a great job.
- One of the spring projects is turf renovations.
- Community Center staff are involved in planning and preparing plant replacement projects in the medians in the parking lot.
- Staff just completed tree trimming at Edith Morley Park. They will be re-establishing some plant material there in the coming weeks.
- We are scheduled to do a parking lot pavement resurfacing and overkoting at the Community Center. That will begin in early April concluding in mid May. This will be completed by our Streets crew with help by our Parks crew.
- The fields are scheduled to re-open. We plan to introduce Bermuda grass to the sports fields in May. This will give us a hardier turf to play on and a little softer cushion.
- March 3 there will be a tree planting on Nido Drive at 9:00 am. This will be the last event of the Measure Q grant. You are all invited to participate if you would like to attend.
- Bunnies and Bonnets parade is coming up March 31. Public Works will be entering a float again.
- We had a great volunteer event in January at Marijane Hamann Park on Martin Luther King Jr's birthday. We had a number of Parks Commissioners out there, Council members and Assemblyman Evan Low.
- Alex read the weekly update to Council regarding the Community Garden.

Recreation and Community Services: Director Maurantonio

- The Campbell Youth Basketball League is underway, with 260 youngsters learning the game of basketball, building friendships, developing social skills, and being active. On Friday, January 26th the Campbell Adult Center along with the Campbell Youth Commission hosted a "Teens Teach Tech" event at the Community Center.
- The Campbell Youth Commission hosted a Resume Workshop on February 2, 2018 from 4:30-5:45pm at the Campbell Library. College and career specialists from the Campbell Union High School District presented information regarding employment interview techniques.
- The Campbell Youth Commission and Civic Improvement Commission will be hosting a job fair for high school students on February 9, 2018 from 3:30-5:30pm in the Orchard City Banquet Hall.
- Office Specialist position open now. Closes on February 12th. (2 openings—one in Reservations and one in Registration/Activity Guide)
- The Adult Center will be hosting a Chinese New Year celebration on February 23rd.

Due to the lack of a quorum, approval of the minutes of the February 7, 2018 meeting was postponed to the April 4, 2018 meeting.

Oral Requests:

None.

New Business:

A. Sports, Aquatics and Fitness Operations

Recreation Supervisor Aaron Bueno gave a presentation on his department oversight. He oversees:

- Aquatics
- Fitness Program
- Adult Sports
- Youth Sports
- Skatepark
- Oktoberfest & Valentine Fun Runs

He has two full-time staff and 80 part-time staff members.

The estimated revenue from these programs is \$1,026,000:

- Aquatics \$317,000
- Fitness \$191,000
- Sports \$470,000
- Skatepark \$31,000
- Fun Runs \$17,000
-

One of the big challenges they are facing is the pool and locker room facilities.

B. Bunnies and Bonnets Parade

Director Maurantonio said the Parade will be held Saturday, March 31. She asked if the Commissioners would like to participate either riding on the Public Works float or walking along next to it. She also said in the past the Commission has given out things like t-shirts, reusable bags or tomato plants.

After discussion it was decided to hand out fruit snacks while walking along next to the float.

C. 2018 -19 Work Plan Development

Director Maurantonio handed out a draft of the work plans to the Commissioners. Tonight is just to have a conversation around this and she will bring it back at a future meeting.

The General Plan still figures in the Work Plan. There are a couple of policy things coming up, turf conversion policy and urban forest management plan. The Parkland Dedication Fund will be on the Work Plan every year. Last night Council did approve the Commission's recommendation for the Parkland Dedication Fund allocations. There will be some park improvement projects to review next fiscal year and staff will need assistance in developing funding options for the pool renovation.

Also, the Council will be interested in having a representative from each Commission to attend one council meeting and give a small snapshot of the Commission.

The Commissioners said the draft plan was very well thought out and representative of the work and goals of the Commission.

D. All-Inclusive Playground Update

Superintendent Mordwinow stated staff is going to Council on March 20 to seek approval to apply for a grant from the County for an All-Inclusive Playground at John D. Morgan Park – Budd side. There is currently \$850,000 budgeted for a project at that site. The grant is a one for one match, and staff hopes to receive a \$1M grant. The total project would be \$2M.

E. Campbell Park Update

Superintendent Mordwinow said we are currently budgeted for \$150,000 for design of the project and we received approval at Council last night to hire a consultant for the design.

Committee Reports:

Parks and Creek Trail: Chair Doherty went to all the parks this past month and all the parks are looking great. She gave kudos to Public Works staff and Parks Supervisor Huppe.

Trees: Commissioner Mitchell said she thought there was a tree planting event, but Superintendent Mordwinow stated it had been cancelled due to the rain.

Special Events: Commissioner Ishibashi said we are up to date on the Bunnies and Bonnets parade for March 31.

Staff Reports:

A. General Plan Monthly Update

Director Maurantonio said the last neighborhood meeting for the General Plan was held March 5, there were about 70 people in attendance. The next step will be some kind of consolidation of all the feedback from the workshops. There is also a survey that residents can take.

Parks: Public Works Maintenance Superintendent Mordwinow

- Superintendent Mordwinow announced April 21 is the Great American Litter Pickup. It will begin at Campbell Park, 9 a.m. to noon.
- Also on April 21, there will be a volunteer project at the Civic Center. This will be demolition and removal of a number of the grass areas and park strips surrounding the Civic Center. The following weekend the same volunteers will be replanting and placing mulch in the areas where the grass was removed. The same organization is also working with the Veterans Memorial Foundation to do some work at the Memorial.
- Staff will also be replanting at Edith Morley Park in the next few weeks.
- A major effort will be made at the Budd side of John D. Morgan Park. Staff will be removing the sand and replacing it with fibar.
- The fences around the athletic fields were taken down a few weeks ago. We will close them again the beginning of May to introduce Bermuda grass. The fields will be opened mid-June.
- Arbor Day will be Friday, April 27th in the Nido neighborhood. Superintendent Mordwinow acknowledged Bob Siudzinski for all his efforts on the Measure Q grant and the planting of all the trees.
- We are applying for a Cal Fire Grant for an Urban Forest Management plan.
- The Community Garden waiting list has been eliminated and we have one plot open.
- We are scheduled to begin slurring the parking lots at the Community Center. Staff has replanted some of the small medians there.
- The Community Center playground breaks ground next week.
- He will be meeting with Judge Bernal to decide on a spot for the Peralta ranch historical plaque.

Several Commissioners said they had noticed the newly planted medians and they look beautiful.

Recreation and Community Services: Director Maurantonio

- The Youth Commission hosted a Teen Lock in Party at the Library on Friday, March 2nd. Over 50 middle schoolers enjoyed laser tag, food and minute-to-win-it games.
- The Youth Commission will take part in the YAC Attack on Saturday, March 10th in Cupertino. This is a conference of youth commissions throughout the bay area.
- Thank you to the Commission for your excellent help on the Valentine Fun Run! We had over 560 participants and gorgeous weather!!
- On **Sunday, March 4** Staff will hosted an exhibit reception and FREE Day at the Ainsley House to celebrate two new exhibits:
- *Dressed in Context: Women's Changing Fashion 1900-1930*, located inside the Carriage House will explore the change in ladies fashion that occurred between the two periods in time, how the fashion was influenced by the changes in the world and how society was influenced by fashion.

The exhibit was guest curated by Cassie Caruth, a Museum Collections Intern and women's historical fashions expert.

- And, Looking Down & Looking Back: Aerial Photography of Campbell will feature aerial photographs from the Museum's permanent collection paired with present day drone photography from a local photographer, Jason Brickman. The exhibit demonstrates the changes from the earliest aerial images of the valley beginning in the 1930s through to modern images of Campbell's role and development within Silicon Valley.
- If you are at the Community Center over the next several days you will notice that all of the drinking fountains are closed. A random sampling of water fountains were tested for lead and by San Jose Water Company and the initial results came back that 11 of the 12 samples tested below the threshold for lead, whereas one water fountain in Building B was identified as being over the limit for lead in drinking water. Additional testing is needed and a precautionary measure, San Jose Water Company recommended that the water fountains be closed throughout the campus. San Jose Water Company is providing bottled water in the meantime. All schools and tenants have been notified. The water testing will be done at 6 a.m. tomorrow and we hope to have results next week.

Commissioner Gibson went to the opening of the photo show at the Ainsley House. It was an interesting perspective because you do get to see how the City is being built in. The comparative photos were from the early 60's. He also met Janet Hedley from the SCVWD at Edith Morley Park. They set up educational stations for school programs.


