### NEW BUSINESS

1. Campbell Union High School District Presentation: Superintendent Bravo and Sarah Kennedy from CUHSD presented on where the district would like to go in the upcoming years; in a study from last year's graduating class, 78% of students went off to college; Superintendent Bravo would like to continue that growth through proper education and resources for the students; mental health and school counselors were areas of need voiced from different teens
2. Youth Commission work plan & subcommittee development
  - a. **Environment:** Commissioner Yarkov was selected as the Chair; events for the year include trash cleanups, tree plantings, an Earth day fair at a Campbell park, recycling programs and a compost program

  - d. **Mental Health:** Commissioner Gadagkar was selected as the Chair; events for the year include the NAMI presentation after school, therapy dogs in November and in the spring, a mental health distress day at the Cinelux Theatres, and a new initiative called “humans of Campbell” where teens are featured on the Campbell Youth Commission Instagram
  - e. **Academic:** Commissioner Castillo was selected as the Chair; events for this subcommittee include a monthly tutoring workshop at the Campbell Library, and a potential reading day at a local elementary school (Forest Hill or Rosemary)
  - f. **Seniors:** Commissioner Bender was selected as the Chair; events for this subcommittee include a Bingo Night with seniors in November, a brunch & Tech Talk in November, a winter craft event with preschool kids and seniors in December, and a Nature Day/Walk in the spring
  - g. **Recreation:** Commissioners Kim and Wolf are the Chairs for this committee; events for this subcommittee include a Halloween Movie Night in October, a pumpkin carving night in October, a middle school Library Lock-In in the spring, a cake walk in January to raise funds for a specific organization, and a Leprechaun Trap Making event in March
