ANIMAL ADVENTURES W/ GARY

FRI. APRIL 19 8:30am – 5:15pm \$90

Our wonderful guide Gary Holloway will give us his unique perspective on the relationship between animals and people as we visit two organizations that specialize in this. Discover the unique mission of people rescuing animals and animals rescuing people at the Tony La Russa's Animal Rescue Foundation (ARF) in Walnut Creek. ARF has rescued more than 40,000 cats and dogs plus they run programs to strengthen the human-animal bond for seniors, children, hospital patients, veterans and people in disadvantaged circumstances. Delight in a hosted lunch at Back Forty Texas BBQ with your lunch choice of: Pork Ribs, Smoked Beef Brisket or Smoked Turkey Breast. Next we will travel to the Lindsay Wildlife Experience. Lindsay is the first wildlife hospital established in the United States and features a number of California wildlife exhibits, natural history specimens, and one of the largest rehabilitation centers that treats over 5,000 injured, sick or orphaned wild animals each year. THUR. JULY 18 8:15am – 5:30pm \$99



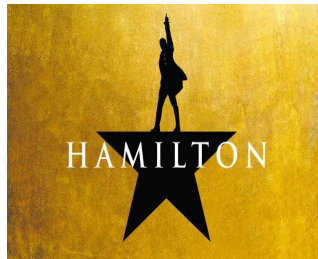
Indulge in a hosted brunch buffet at the Spinnaker in Sausalito. This special restaurant is known for their stunning panoramic

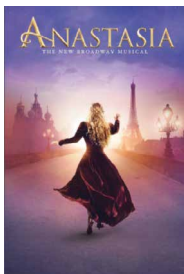

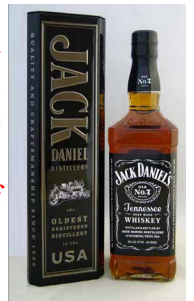

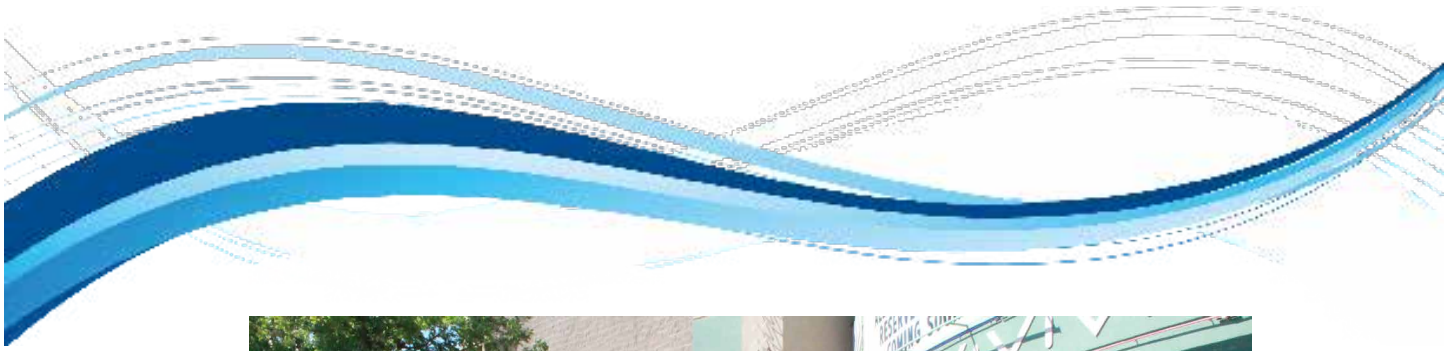
